Emerging health issues / threats

Bluetongue updated Winter 2024

As cases of Bluetongue continue to move closer to Wiltshire, we urge clients to remain vigilant and continue monitoring and taking preventative measures against the virus. - **Betamox:** we have a strong supply in stock despite ongoing disruptions.
- Cepravin DC: will be changing to Cepritect DC tubes.
- Engemycin Spray: will change to Alamycin spray.
- Ubrostar Red: is now back in stock!
- **New Arrival:** We are now stocking Farm Fluid MAX, a versatile disinfectant which can be used as part of Coccidiosis control protocols.

Stress-free disbudding

Are you struggling to keep up with disbudding? Unfortunately, postponing it can make the procedure more challenging and time consuming. Under veterinary supervision, our vet techs can help with this. Stress-free disbudding involves administering a small amount of sedative along with a local anaesthetic and long-acting pain relief allowing large batches to be disbudded quickly and efficiently. Research has demonstrated several benefits of stress-free disbudding including:

- Minimises pain and stress, ensuring calves experience minimal discomfort during and after the procedure.
- Promotes a positive handling experience.

Better growth and productivity

- Reduced stress levels lead to better feed conversion and weight gain.

- Effective pain relief decreases the likelihood of infection or healing complications.
- Stress-free methods ensure calves remain calm, reducing risk of injury during the process.

A new pen side test for liver fluke

We are now stocking a rapid, pen side test for the diagnosis of liver fluke *(Fasciola hepatica)* in cattle and sheep. This easy-touse test detects antibodies



in the blood of infected animals using a simple blood droplet from the ear or nose, providing results in just 10 minutes. The test enables detection of liver fluke from as early as two weeks offering the opportunity to implement targeted treatment plans and reduce the overuse of flukicides.

When left untreated, liver fluke can have a significant impact on both animal welfare and productivity. If you would like to learn more about the test or purchase a box from the practice for use on farm, please get in touch.

A new preventative vaccine for calf scour

New funding available....

The Future Farming Resilience Funding is a valuable and flexible resource designed to help reduce disease and improve herd health on farms. Only a select number of UK vet practices, including ours, have been approved to deliver this funding. All farms are eligible, provided they have not accessed this funding through another provider.

What's included?

Each farm can receive up to £1,540 per farm for up to four visits (£385/visit), which can be used for a variety of services designed to help optimise health and productivity. Services could *(but are not limited to)* include:

- Housing ventilation assessment, cow comfort, enrichments
- Infectious disease health protection Johnes, IBR, Lepto, Lungworm, Ringworm, orf, BTV-3
- Parasite best practice internal and external parasites and associated anthelmintic resistance
- Infertility male and female causes
- Mastitis control plan environmental assessment, VaDia dynamic parlour testing
